KARTCHNER CAVERNS STATE PARK



One of the many state parks in Arizona is actually a cave showcasing 2.4 miles of passages. Located 9 miles south of Benson and west of the San Pedro River. Discovered in 1974 by some local cavers with the assistance of a state biologist who helped preserve it.

TOMBSTONE COURTHOUSE STATE HISTORIC PARK



The park preserves the original courthouse of Cochise County. The Victorian style building was constructed in 1882. The courtyard contains a replica gallows to mark the spot where 7 men were hung for various crimes.

Lawrence Schieffelin. Indian scout and prospector. He was the one who founded Tombstone all because he had discovered silver in the Arizona Territory. The Schieffelin Monument is the final resting place for Ed Schieffelin.
